# Inspiration House Comes to Stapleton

**▼**he Home Builders Foundation and New Town Builders have teamed up with Forest City Stapleton, Inc. to bring Inspiration House to Stapleton.

Inspiration House is an annual fundraising program in which a member of the Home Builders Association of Metropolitan Denver (HBA) builds a new home below normal cost using donated materials and labor. Dubbed Inspiration House, the home is then sold at full market value with all profits donated to the Home Builders Foundation to assist people who have been disabled through acts of crime or other tragic circumstances. New Town Builders, one of 19 builders constructing homes at Stapleton, will construct the 2004 Inspiration House in the 2500 block of Xenia Street, just south of Greenway Park, on land donated by Forest City Stapleton, Inc., master developer of the former airport property.

"The Inspiration House is a remarkable way for Denver's home builders to give back to their community," said Jack Dorwart, Home Builders Foundation president and owner of Bonaventure Homes. "The 2004 Inspiration House represents a tremendous commitment of time, materials, labor and services from New Town Builders, Forest City Stapleton, Inc. and their associates."

"Through Inspiration House, the Home Builders Foundation has the funds to help victims of crime and circumstance," said Gene Myers, principal and founder of New Town Builders. "We are pleased to be a part of this unique fundraiser and look forward to having this opportunity to give back to the community."

Among the dignitaries attending the groundbreaking ceremony was Colorado Governor Bill Owens who announced that the Home Builders Foundation will make a \$25,000 contribution to assist John Hessler's family with medical expenses resulting from injuries the former University of Colorado quarterback and Adams County middle school teacher suffered in a hit-and-run accident

"The worst consequence of any act of crime is the violence inflicted on innocent victims," said Governor Owens. "Inspiration House is one way we can assist people who have been disabled by crime, and it's a great example of Coloradans coming together to help one another."

"We applaud New Town Builders and the Home Builders Foundation for the important contribution they are making to our community, and we are proud to support them in that effort," (continued on page 4)

# Charity Chase to Christen Stapleton Parks

Deople of all ages will lace up their running and walking shoes on Saturday, June 5th as the 3rd Annual Charity Chase 5K-Run/ Walk and Family Fun Walk & Stroll officially opens the new Greenway Park at Stapleton.

The Charity Chase benefits Catholic Charities Emergency Assistance Centers, which provide assistance in six

different

neighborhoods to **CHARITY CHASE 2004** keep families

together and prevent homelessness. About 500 to 600 runners participate each year. The staging area for this year's event, which begins at 9 a.m., will be one block east of 24th and Syracuse. A registration form and fee information are provided on page 7.

The course for the 2004 Charity Chase will wind its way through Stapleton's new Greenway Park. Greenway Park is comprised of 45 acres of linear green space that links the first new neighborhoods at Stapleton with Fred Thomas Park and the adjacent neighborhoods of East Montclair and Park Hill to the south and west. The new green space features tennis courts, a three-acre "off-leash" dog park, an outdoor

pavilion and playground, climbing wall, jogging paths and skate park. Greenway Park is the first of more than 1100 acres of new parks and open space that will be created at Stapleton.





# Addressing Pedestrian Safety Along Quebec

By Michael B. Hancock City Councilman, District 11 used to take for granted that motorists **⊥** traveling along Quebec Street would slow down for the increased pedestrian traffic at Stapleton and Quebec Square. Of course, that was until I was contacted by several concerned Park Hill residents, Forest City representatives and the Metropolitan Organization for People about the hazards pedestrians face crossing

Quebec. I applaud all these entities for stepping up to the plate and for promoting a strong voice for all citizens wanting to enjoy the new amenities east of Quebec.

The number one priority lauded by everyone involved was the unimpeded safety of every person, whether they are a motorist or a

pedestrian, along Quebec. Allow me to frame the issue for those of you who may be unaware of the problem. Motorists, particularly those traveling

Quebec, are traveling at a rate of speed that is endangering the safety of pedestrians who are crossing Quebec to either visit or leave the shops along the street,

south on

primarily between 38th and 26th streets. Several great ideas were suggested to

mitigate the situation, including building a pedestrian bridge across Quebec. Here is a list of the action steps that have been negotiated with the City and County of Denver's Traffic Engineering Department:

A traffic analysis is currently being conducted to determine where mitigation is needed most.

Once the analysis is completed pedestrian crossing signals will be modified to give pedestrians as much as an additional five seconds to cross the street.

Additional pedestrian crossing signs will be installed near the viaduct and flashing signals may accompany the signs.

An education campaign will be initiated to familiarize all residents on the edict of crossing busy thoroughfares and the intricacies of signalizations.

These steps are important to our overall goal of ensuring pedestrian safety. # **ALPS Pushes Pedestrian Safety**

Those issues include pedestrian safety on Quebec Street and bike and transit connectivity to the proposed retail center North of I-70, as well as to Fitzsimons.

The ALPS policy task force is working in coordination with the Stapleton Transportation Management Association, The Stapleton Foundation, Forest City Stapleton, The City of Denver and organizations throughout the community to develop design policy recommendations that will encourage active living among area residents and employees of all ages. (continued from page 1) said Denise Gammon, senior vice president-residential development for Forest City Stapleton, Inc. "This program should be a 'source of inspiration' for everyone in the home builder industry who is looking for a unique way to give back to help people in need."

The 2004 Inspiration House built by New Town Builders will be the 2,323 square-foot Logan model. This two-story home, priced at \$470,000, features tenfoot ceilings on the first floor, two and one half baths, and four bedrooms. There is also a formal dining room, formal living room, and a two-car garage. The projected profit from the sale of the house that will be donated to the Home Builders Foundation is in excess of \$250,000.00.

Formed in 1993, The Home Builders Foundation partners with suppliers, homebuilders, subcontractors and other volunteers to help those who desperately need enhancement or accessibility to their homes. The Foundation works closely with Craig Hospital in helping disabled individuals who have included victims of the Columbine High School shootings and other victims of crime and tragedy in the Denver Metropolitan Area. Several times a week I am asked about the success of Stapleton. My answer is always the same. Success is measured in different ways. For many, our responsibility is to dispose of the former airport property and to see that processes are in place to achieve the principles of the Stapleton Development Plan (Green Book). If you measure success by the sale of land and our development of regional open space, most would con-

clude that some level of success has been achieved.

For most at SDC success will be measured in the years to come by matters not yet achieved and results difficult to measure. It's one matter to create attractive streetscapes, beautiful parks, new services for the area, employment opportunities, affordable housing, diverse neighborhoods and sustainable development. Can these efforts be sustained?

Some successes are obvious. Spring blossoms confirm the wisdom of the extensive

sustainable landscape programs. Resident interest in their community is indicated by the formation of SUN and their positive approach to neighborhood concerns. Retail establishments are providing increased employment opportunities and needed area services.

There are an increasing number of opportunities for residents to enjoy the services and amenities of Stapleton. The dog run opens on Memorial Day, the Greenway opens officially with the Charity Chase on June 5, portions of Westerly Creek will open in late spring and Central Park will soon be under construction. Retail shops in the Town Center are staffed by diverse and consumer friendly shopkeepers. A growing number of residents are enjoying the opportunity to spend more time with their families because their commuting times have been reduced. Expanding families indicate that Stapleton is a good place to raise a family. Seniors are selecting smaller living units to have more leisure time and to be

closer to their children. Visitors from across the country visit to learn more about how we implement the Plan.

The real measure of success, however, will be for others to judge. Will this community produce sustainable outcomes? Will children have a better opportunity to achieve their dreams and will they achieve those dreams? Will the level of architectural integrity be maintained as the community matures? Will the patterns of diversity

that have been established in the workforce continue? Will the neighborhood connections be made north of Stapleton and to existing neighborhoods with the new areas of development? Will the quality of the park programs and their maintenance be sustained given the reality of public budget constraints? With continued support of the City and the community I believe all of these challenges can be met.

Finally are the most important measurements of success. Will this be a better community than it would have been without the Stapleton Development Plan?

Will the residents achieve a better lifestyle than they might have achieved by living somewhere else? Will the small business people who have risked financial security by being part of the pioneering spirit of Stapleton succeed? Will the neighborhoods surrounding Stapleton enjoy their expectations from the new development? Will the residents of Stapleton continue to maintain their pioneering spirit by being meaningfully engaged in the many opportunities to serve the needs of the area? Stapleton is exciting because the list of challenges is dynamic.

SDC, the Stapleton Foundation and Forest City can provide opportunities for success but real success will be met through sustainable efforts of the residents of the area.

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# A Message from Bluff Lake's Education Director

Dear Stapleton Residents:

As a new Stapleton resident, you are busy exploring all the new amenities that are within walking

or biking distance from your home. I would like to introduce you to a very special place that existing neighborhoods have cherished for years, Bluff Lake Nature Center. Now, while your home may be new, Bluff Lake is not. Because of its unique landscape, you can explore several different habitats in a small area. Wetlands, a creek, forested areas and a shortgrass prairie provide homes for many bird and animals species. Bluff Lake was preserved in 1923 as part of the buffer zone around the Stapleton International Airport.

It was within this protective buffer that wild animals lived and thrived.

In 1994 a small non-profit, Friends of Bluff Lake, was formed to provide environmental education to students who would not otherwise have such experiences. Friends of Bluff Lake worked hard to provide free environmental education programs to these students and even provided reimbursement of school bus expenses. 2004 is the 10th anniversary of environmental education at Bluff Lake. A lot has changed in these 10 years, including our name, Bluff Lake Nature Center. One thing has not changed and that is our commitment to environmental education.

Of course nature is not just for the young, it is for everyone to enjoy. Residents of Stapleton are close enough to enjoy the daily benefits of Bluff Lake from home. You may see bald eagles fly over-head, or hear the call of coyotes at dusk as you sit on your front porch. You may even notice a variety of songbirds in your garden. But to truly appreciate the uniqueness of this refuge in the city, you may want to visit Bluff Lake. Take a walk with your kids, read the educational signs, listen to the birds, watch the animals, or take pictures.

You can help us protect the wildlife at Bluff

Lake by staying on trails and quietly observing animals. Please use the Sand Creek Trail to walk your dogs and ride your bikes. Bluff Lake offers a

bike rack for your convenience as well as free parking. Bluff Lake Nature Center offers a variety of programs to the public throughout the summer months.

Our new Fire Circle will be the setting for "Fireside Chats" and marshmallow roasts. Enjoy the sunset over the Rocky Mountains as you learn about the natural history around you. Keep an eye on your intranet for a schedule of programs.

Residents visiting from the Stapleton neighborhood can take Montview east to Moline. Turn left on Moline (north) past 25th St. The entrance

to Bluff Lake will be on your right about 1/4 mile north of 25th Street. You will not see Bluff Lake from the road because the entire refuge is situated below natural bluffs. When you walk

down the bluff into the refuge, you will notice that the sights and sounds of the city virtually disappear.

To help celebrate our 10th anniversary, we will

be hosting a contest for photos taken at Bluff Lake. Photos will be accepted at the Bluff Lake Nature Center Administrative offices (7350 E. 29th Avenue, third floor)

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



# HOW TO MAKE YOUR GARDEN MORE BEAUTIFUL AND "WATER WISE"

Its that time of the year again! Time to work in the garden – and work in the garden using water efficiently. Below are some tips provided by the Denver Botanic Garden.

- Improve your soil by incorporating organic matter, such as compost, and through rototiling.
- Aerate your lawn to allow water and air to penetrate compacted soil, providing better nourishment to plants.
   An aerated lawn adapts more quickly to staying healthy with less water.
- Mulch around plants to suppress weeds and retain moisture.
- Space plants closely together when planting so that they shade the soil.
- Buy a rain gauge or use old soup cans placed randomly in your garden to see how evenly you are watering and how long it takes your sprinklers to water one inch.
- Use a moisture gauge to assess whether your plants actually need water, or check two or three inches deep to see if the soil is moist.

### Lawn Watering

- Permitted 2 days per week
- Odd numbered addresses may water on Saturday and Wednesday.
- Even numbered addresses may water on Sunday and Thursday.
- 15 minutes per zone (average)
- No watering 10 a.m. to 6 p.m.
- No limit to number of zones

# Trees and Shrubs

Water by a hand-held hose or low-volume non-spray irrigation on assigned watering days but not between the hours of 10 a.m. and 6 p.m.

# Flowers and Vegetables

Water with a hand-held hose or low-volume non-spray irrigation on any day except Monday and not between the hours of 10 a.m. and 6 p.m.






Xcel Energy's Renewable Energy Trust Provides \$30,000 Grant

The system has 12 solar panels and generates enough energy to light one classroom. Teachers can use the data acquisition system (DAS) for science instruction that includes solar and weather information about energy generated over time, money saved by the energy from the PV panels, outside air temperature, wind speed, daily fluctuations in temperature and the sun's energy.

# **Crime Prevention Awareness Pays Off**

Greetings from the Denver Police Department. Warm weather is upon us, trees are budding, flowers and grasses are blooming and greening, and summer evenings and backyard barbeques await.

It is truly a wonderful time of the year, and with the anticipation and enjoyment of outdoor activities and events, we take a moment to contemplate and review our crime prevention efforts.

2003 Crime Statistics show a decrease in all categories of major reported crimes in the North Park Hill and Northeast Park Hill neighborhoods. North Park Hill showed a 17.1% decrease in reported crimes during the statistical period from the year 2002 to 2003. Northeast Park Hill showed a 20.2% decrease in reported crime during the same period. South Park Hill dropped in crime frequency in Denver neighborhoods from 31st to 45th.

Our residents are to be commended for their efforts to work in partnership with the Denver Police Department, to reduce crime and increase overall safety, by participating in Neighborhood Watch efforts, and calling or contacting the Police Department to report criminal or

suspicious activities.

Please remember to close your overhead garage doors and entry doors, during your gardening and lawn care activities. Check your garage

and entry doors to determine if they are shut and locked when leaving for work in the morning and upon your return in the evening, or leaving for activities during the day.

Open garage doors and open entry doors provide an opportunity for burglars to enter the unsecured residence, and remove purses or wallets from entryway or kitchen tables, or remove bicycles or lawn

equipment from garages.

Auto Theft and Theft from

Motor Vehicles continue to be a problem in the metro area. Citizens are reminded to not leave articles in plain view in their vehicles that are parked. Secure items in the trunk of the vehicle and check to ensure that the vehicle is locked. Please do not leave your vehicle running or unattended with the keys inside as you leave in the morning or enter a store or business, even for a few moments. Even if a vehicle is locked, it takes mere seconds to enter and remove it when it is left running.

# Forest City Official Always on the Run

Heidi Majerik, senior residential development manager for Forest City Stapleton, Inc., is a woman constantly on the move. When she is not managing the development of our residential neighborhoods at Stapleton, Heidi competes in "Adventure Racing" – an extremely demanding athletic competition that combines running, kayaking and mountain biking.

Over the last two years, Heidi has competed in "sprint races," which are one-day events that cover 55 to 60 miles. All races include some form of kayaking (white water or flat water), trail running, mountain biking, and "orienteering," which requires the use of a compass and map to navigate from one check point to another over an unmarked race course. Some races also include rope work such as the recent competition in Moab, Utah in which Heidi rappelled 250 feet down the side of a mountain. All races typically take Heidi 9 hours to run. To get herself in shape for competition this year, Heidi has run two 10k snowshoe races (one of which she came in as one of the top finishers), one 5k snowshoe race, and a winter "quadrathalon" in New Mexico. The New Mexico competition involved a 44mile race up and down a mountain and required road biking, running, cross-country skiing, and snowshoeing.

This fall, Heidi will be competing in her first 24-hour, 100 mile Adventure Race in Vail and she hopes to compete in her first expedition-length race (350-450 miles) next year. Ultimately, she has set her sights on

the Subaru Primal Quest, which is a nationally televised race scheduled to be run this fall. Heidi is currently gathering sponsorships to offset some of the costs of competing in that event.
